

the man who brought the 19 1/2 -foot-high mahogany chair to Anacostia in 1959 and created a lasting landmark, has died. He was 82. Mr. Curtis, who died March 29 at Suburban Hospital of a heart attack after a fall, initially was looking for a way to lure customers into his family's furniture showroom at what is now V Street and Martin Luther King Avenue SE. He commissioned Bassett Furniture Industries in North Carolina to build the 4,600-pound version of a Duncan Phyfe dining room chair and had it delivered on a flatbed truck. Touted as the "the world's largest chair," the hefty seat immediately became a neighborhood attraction. A young woman spent 42 days atop the chair in a glass booth with a balcony. A larger-than-life Santa Claus perched there and waved to passersby. The chair survived the 1968 riots unscathed, and when weather took its toll, it was rebuilt, this time from aluminum. In March 2006, Mr. Curtis watched as the rebuilt chair was unveiled. He recalled that no matter how the neighborhood changed, the chair endured, in part because the community was attached to it. "No one laid a hand on the chair" during the riots, he told The Washington Post. "They had respect for it." "And it will stay there for 100 years," he added. A Washington native, Mr. Curtis had long ties to Southeast Washington, where his family's furniture business opened in 1926. He attended elementary school there and graduated from Anacostia High School in 1942. During World War II, he became a pilot in the Army Air Forces, and he remained in the Air Force Reserve for 10 years. He received a bachelor's degree from the University of Maryland in 1949 and spent a year at Georgetown University law school. After graduating from college, he joined Curtis Bros. Furniture as a sales manager and rose to general manager before serving as president. In the early 1960s, he spent a year as national advertising manager for Kroehler Manufacturing Co. He was national merchandising manager at Simmons Co. from 1974 to 1983, when he retired. Always looking for ways to promote the family business, Mr. Curtis decided in 1960 to have a 10-by-10-foot glass booth built and placed on the big chair. He hired a 19-year-old woman to live there. "Every few hours she would slip out onto the balcony to wave to crowds drawn by newspaper and radio ads that invited them to see 'Alice in the "Looking Glass" House' and guess how long she could remain up there," The Post reported. Mr. Curtis, a resident of Brandywine for 62 years before moving to Leesburg last year, was involved in civic activities. He was area chairman of the Greater Washington Chapter of the Leukemia Society of America, director of the German Orphan Home, president of the Anacostia Lions Club, vice president and director of the National Home Furnishings Association, director of the Franklin Savings & Loan Association in Washington and a member of the retail committee of the Greater Washington Board of Trade. His marriage to Dorothy McLean Curtis ended in divorce. Survivors include his wife, Hilda F. Curtis of Leesburg; six children from his first marriage, Pamela Rizzo of Fort Washington, Carol Lee Curtis of Vail, Colo., Barbara Jedrey of Davidsonville, Md., Charles W. I'm dead of lung cancer at age 69, after 34 years of not smoking, anything. It's one of life's little editorial comments. What an eye-opener life turned out to be! Born to H. Gould Curtis and Alice Turner Curtis in Connecticut in 1940, I was a shy, unsure kid who finally ran away from dancing school at age 12 to prove to myself that I had some guts. But my parents made me write a letter of apology to the dancing school teacher on my Boy Scout stationary. That was the start of a long learning curve. At Berkshire School in Sheffield, Mass. (1955-58), I was prodded into positions of leadership that I didn't want, and I plodded along as a ho-hum student for three years. So, it was with great surprise and some suspicion that I learned of my acceptance to Trinity College in Hartford, Conn. ('58-'62). But there I began to understand that learning is really quite a fancy adventure. In the U.S. Army ('62-'63), I learned about the pros and cons of hierarchy and about tail-numbing boredom. While teaching at the American School in Switzerland in Lugano ('63-'65), and hanging out with the artworks of Europe and traveling alone through Italy, France, Portugal and Spain, I discovered the intriguing idiosyncrasies of other cultures and how to embrace them all. Earning an M.A. from the Writing Seminars ('66) at Johns Hopkins University opened the door for me to accept a creative writing teaching position at Montana State University ('67-'70). Well-tutored in academic pettiness and politics after three years of teaching there, I was promoted, and I resigned, leaving with five other instructors to start an experimental school in New Mexico. That experiment in communal living and experiential learning taught me that I was not a groupie kind of guy. Back in Bozeman, I took a job loading former MSU students and colleagues on the Alpine Lift at Bridger Bowl for a winter ('71). Their curious, dismayed and embarrassed reactions to my apparent "fall from grace" became an amusing study in socio-psychology. After two more years of teaching ('72-'73) at the Colorado Rocky Mountain School in Carbondale, I finally realized that I was really a good student, not a good teacher. And it was at CRMS that I met Linda Sullivan, the woman who became my lifelong love, closest confidant, best friend, breadwinner and wife. We settled into the log cabin that we built and hammered on for decades in South Cottonwood Canyon. Linda became a private voice teacher, the mom of our three great kids -Patrick, Molly and Will (Oh, what things I learned from them!) - and the artistic director of Intermountain Opera. I established a career as a freelance writer, writing articles on camping and backpacking, hunting and fishing, natural history and the environment, and arts and architecture for national and regional magazines. Given my student temperament, it was the best poor-paying career I could have chosen. Article assignments from editors were like homework assignments that required researching, interviewing, going out in the field and collecting information and anecdotes for essays that I'd try to organize and present in engaging ways. It was a process I loved and struggled with during my entire career. It was forever challenging, never easy, and always fun. Writing and living gave me a great education, but living with cancer was my postgraduate work. It taught me how to be humble and hopeful, how to laugh at the inevitable, how to be accepting and defiant in the same breath and how to run away from dancing school, again and again. My loving family, great friends, caring doctors and nurses, even charming no-goodniks and serendipitous strangers, were my best teachers, revealing that offerings of hope, prayers and kindnesses transcend countries of origin, religions of choice and ideologies of preference. We're all in this together. No matter where we're from or what we believe, we will finally reach unanimity in our conclusions. So, my homework is done. I took the final exam. I graduated. It's time to celebrate!

Curtis-Verna, Mary (New York Times) (12/27/2009)

Mary Curtis-Verna, a Metropolitan Opera soprano of the 1950s and '60s who became famous for stepping into the roles of ailing, stranded or otherwise indisposed divas, often on only a few hours' notice, died on Dec. 4 at her home in Seattle. She was 88. The cause was complications of a broken hip, said her executor, Dwyla Donohue. At her death, Ms. Curtis-Verna was emeritus professor of music at the University of Washington, where she had taught from 1969 until her retirement in 1991. Known to opera aficionados for her large, flexible voice and astute musicianship, Ms. Curtis-Verna was associated with the Met from 1956 to 1966. Appearing in nearly 100 performances, she was cast regularly in leading roles, including Tosca and Aida. She was partnered with some of the best-known male singers of the era, among them Leonard Warren, Richard Tucker and Jussi Bjoerling. Ms. Curtis-Verna might not have been quite the household name that some of her contemporaries were. (Besides her, the new hires for the Met's 1956-57 season included Maria Callas.) Her reviews tended to be respectful rather than rapturous. (Critics often took her to task for an insufficiently fiery stage temperament, a

most unusual quality in her line of work.) But Ms. Curtis-Verna had a host of unassailable attributes that in combination made her, as Time magazine wrote in 1958, "the Metropolitan's most highly publicized relief ariapitcher." Ms. Curtis-Verna made her Met debut in February 1957 as Leonora in "Il Trovatore." Reviewing the performance in The New York Times, Howard Taubman wrote that the role "was not easy, and she carried it off with outward evidences of poise." In the years to come, her notices in The Times followed an increasingly familiar pattern: Dec. 1, 1957: 'Aida' Title Role: Mary Curtis. Jan. 4, 1958: a leading role in a Metropolitan Opera production," replacing an indisposed Zinka Milanov as Aida. March 20, 1959: she replaced Leonie Rysanek in the leading role of Amelia in Verdi's 'Ballo in Maschera.' " Jan. 8, 1960: "Miss Curtis-Verna replaced the indisposed Victoria de los Angeles," as Violetta in "La Traviata," There were many others. Mary Virginia Curtis was born in Salem, Mass., on May 9, 1921. She earned a bachelor's degree in music from what was then Hollins College in Roanoke, Va., and afterward studied at the Juilliard School. Performing as Mary Curtis, she began her career in Europe, with Ettore Verna as her coach, whom she married. He died in 1962... She later sang with the New York City and San Francisco Operas before joining the Met. . Her second husband, Giuseppe Basile, is her only immediate survivor. Just what were the qualities that equipped Ms. Curtis-Verna so well for an unplanned career as one of opera's most dependable pinch-hitters? Among them, Ms. Donohue said, were a keen memory, singular good looks, foreign-language ability and a vast knowledge of the operatic literature. It also did not hurt, she added, that Ms. Curtis-Verna already owned costumes for many of the leading soprano roles in the repertory, the product of her early years in Europe.
