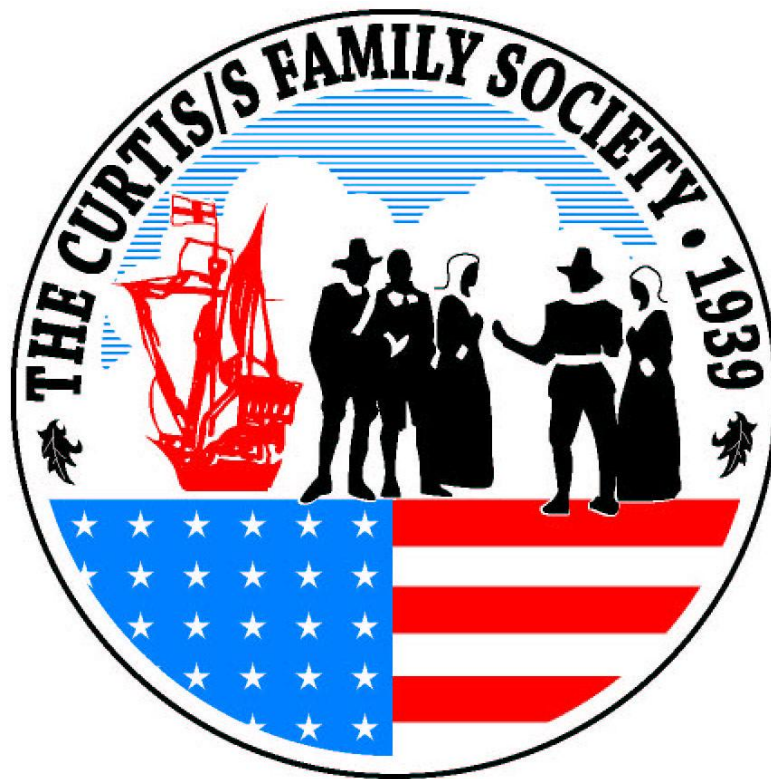

Smith, Prentis Percival (Daily Press, Newport News, VA) (8/5/06)

Family's Legacy is significant piece of area history._(excerpt)

Prentis Percival Smith of Newport News, born May 17, 1906, is placid about being a centenarian. A big birthday buffet brought about 150 celebrants to Endview Plantation, ancestral home of the Curtis and Harwood families. Among Smith's memories are childhood visits at Endview with his grandmother, Maria Whittaker Curtis, widow of Humphrey Harwood Curtis, who traded his farm, Land's End on Mulberry Island, for Endview. The history of expansion of the 1607 Jamestown settlement along the Warwick and James rivers is interwoven with that of the Harwood and Curtis families. Thomas Harwood, named in 1624 among survivors of the 1622 Indian massacre, was listed at Neck of Land in 1625. He had large land holdings including Mulberry Island, Blunt Point at Neck of Land on James Island, and huge tracts now comprising Newport News reservoir. Humphrey Harwood received 2,070 acres in Warwick County from his father, Thom Harwood. Thomas's grandson, another Humphrey inherited this land. The Humphrey name was carried in the next generations until 1769 when William Harwood built Endview. About 1858, Humphrey Harwood Curtis traded Land's End for Endview. Intermarriages of old Virginia families make kinship intricate. Daniel Prentis Curtis, who died in 1881, married William Harwood's granddaughter, Elizabeth Harwood, born at Endview. Their son, Dr. Humphrey Harwood Curtis (Sept. 8, 1832 – Oct. 28, 1881), married Maria Whittaker.
