Lawrence "Larry" Curtis passed away Sunday, October 21st, at his home in Wilmington, NC, at the age of 64. Larry, a devoted and loving husband, will be forever remembered by his wife and best friend Geraldine. He will remain loved and will be thought of and missed dearly by his three children, Ryan, Connor, and Erin, and his three brothers, Ken, Don, and David. Born and raised in Havertown, PA, Larry attended Penn State University on a Naval ROTC scholarship. CLEARWATER - Last week, Charles Curtis II celebrated at the annual holiday dinner for the company he founded. Surrounded by family and friends, he recounted the old war stories he so loved to share. It was his pool of pride. At 21, he was a bombardier aboard a B-17 called Boogie Baby. Mr. Curtis was the old guy in his group. His pilot turned 18 in midair. It was World War II, 1944. Enemies shot the plane at 500 feet over Germany, and it went down in flames. Over Christmas, Mr. Curtis' father sat in stone silence, waiting for word, thinking his son was dead. But he wasn't. He was in a prison camp in Barth, Germany, where he stayed for six months eating only rutabagas and water. The rest of his life, he couldn't eat anything resembling a turnip, no

matter how well it was disguised. Not even sweet potatoes at Thanksgiving. But he told the story, again and again. His family had the best pool in town -50 feet long, 10 feet deep, diving board on one end, water slide on the other. Naturally. Mr. Curtis founded Curtis Pools in 1956, in the days when good pools were mammoth and had springboards. His family lived on more than 10 acres at Nursery and Belcher roads in Clearwater. They had horses and hosted legendary parties on the pool deck, which had a full kitchen. His office was a few steps from home. His kids recall scampering through, enthralled by the hubbub and smell of ammonia from blueprints. His stepson, Randy Pickelmann, started cleaning pools as a teenager. Now, Pickelmann, 59, owns Curtis Pools. Work and family went hand in hand. Mr. Curtis retired in 1990, but he would still come through the offices constantly, just to say hello and make sure people were working. He was charming and loved to talk. Every Friday, he went to Rotary club meetings. He spent time at the Clearwater Yacht Club or the Belleair Country Club. When the sun came up, he'd sing, "Oh, what a beautiful morning..." In his 80s, his biggest concern was what kind of boat to get next. Whenever he saw American flags askew, he would straighten them. He recently started sharing military stories with church groups and the Rotary club. People still cared. He was still proud. Mr. Curtis had back surgery recently and came through standing taller. But on Christmas, decades after living that war story, his heart suddenly stopped. He was 85.
