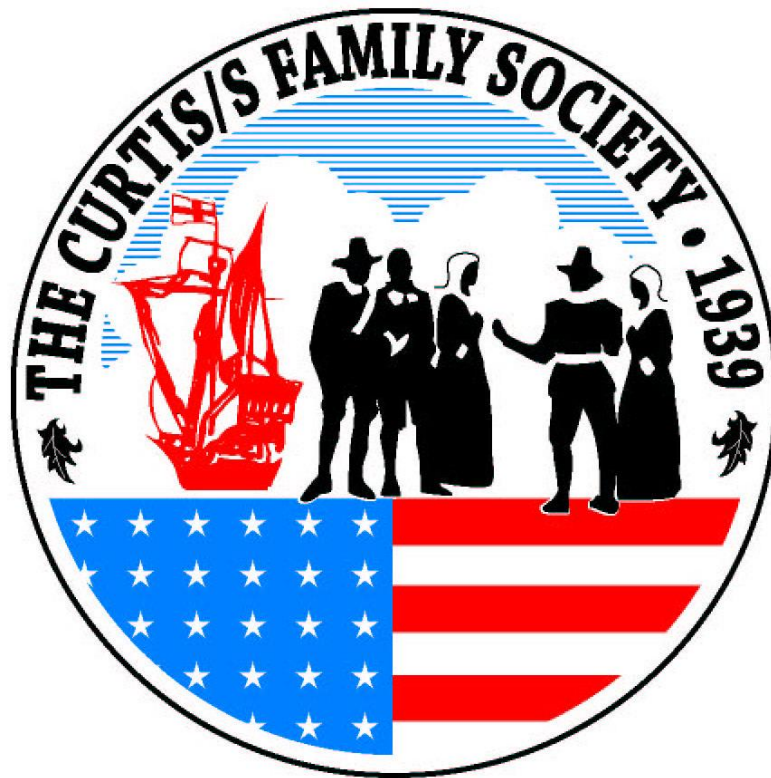

These paper clips have been compiled from a number of sources. Some paper clips have been sent to me from local newspapers, or from various individuals. Most have been collected in electronic form from newspapers or other sites on the Internet. Individuals who submitted paper clips are cited at the end of the submitted paper clip. Newspaper and other sources are also cited.

The full paper clip may be seen on the page indicated in the index after each name. Names are listed by family (ie maiden) names, not married names.

Most paper clips are obituaries, but a few are newspaper clippings about other events in the lives of a Curtis/s relative. Where possible, parents and spouses have been underlined.

Arthur E. Hutchinson, Genealogist, and Archivist of the database for *The Curtis/s Family Society* has reviewed some of the paper clips and has been able to identify the families and genealogical line of many of those. A few other paperclips have been identified by the compiler from the Curtis/s Family Database. All those comments are included in red at the end of each paperclip. However, most paperclips have not been identified.

We hope that if anyone has any additional information about any of the paper clips listed, that they please forward that information to the compiler below to be included in future editions of these paper clips, and to be forwarded to the *The Curtis/s Family Society*.

Originally known as The West Valley Ballet, the company changed its name to San Jose Dance Theatre in 1972 in order to better reflect the scope of its activities and its dancers. He was born with the "writer's itch" and a love of the theatre, which his father, a theatre professor and director, encouraged him to explore. He married the love of his life,

Lynne Loushine Curtis in 1963; together, they had two children, Aimee Lynne and John Earle. In 1966, he joined the Defiance College faculty in Defiance, Ohio, as Theatre Department Chair where he remained until 1974. In addition to teaching theatre and speech classes at Defiance, Professor Curtis also directed over 40 shows at the college sharing his knowledge and love of the arts to new generation of eager young thespians. Professor Curtis directed summer stock at a repertory theatre on Cape Cod, Massachusetts, in 1968 and 1969 and directed municipal outdoor pageants throughout the South and the Midwest. He performed in over 70 productions in summer stock, community theatre, film, commercials, television, and at the university level. Additionally, he authored copy and instructional films for an advertising firm in Cleveland, Ohio, and wrote for several local newspapers. In 1976, he wrote over 90 episodes of "An American Ideal", a radio serial broadcast throughout the country to celebrate the United States Bicentennial. William Curtis was a contributing writer to the ABC drama "Family", produced by Leonard Goldberg, Aaron Spelling, and Mike Nichols. He also served on the Board of Directors for the Rap Art Center in Cleveland and Kent Productions in Kent and was a member of the Writers Guild of America, the Dramatists Guild, and the American Association of University Professors. Throughout these years, William Curtis steadfastly worked on writing his original plays. His first production, "The Place", premiered at Kent State University in 1973 and was also performed at Defiance College the same year. "Garage Sale" premiered at Kent State in 1982 at the Wright-Curtis Theatre. Professor Curtis adapted Charles Dickens' classic "A Christmas Carol" into a musical with colleagues Jeff Richmond and John Cameron; this musical premiered at Kent State in 1982 and continued in production annually for many years across the country. "The Buddy Hobson Show" premiered at Blossom Music Center's Porthouse Theatre in Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, in 1984; "My Last Pair of Jeans" premiered at the Attic Theatre in Appleton, Wisconsin, in 1990, and was also produced at Cuyahoga Community College in 1994. "Moment of Dignity", co-written with friend and collaborator Frank Lucas, premiered at the Hermit Club in Cleveland in 2000. William Curtis's magnum opus, "Lester Sims Retires Tomorrow", premiered to rave reviews at the Melrose Theatre in North Hollywood, California, 1980, and starred George Murdock and Jennifer Rhodes; the play won the LA Weekly Award for Best New Play of 1981. "Lester Sims Retires Tomorrow" was nominated for the Pulitzer Prize for Drama; further productions of the show included East Texas University in 1986, Bratenahl Playhouse, Bratenahl, Ohio in 1988, and the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay in 1995. The screenplay of "Lester" adapted by Gerald Berns is in preproduction. Above all, William Curtis was a family man. For many years he took voice lessons and performed in numerous plays at Woodstock's Little Theatre and in the St. James Church choir. He loved anything to do with the outdoors: spring skiing in Tuckerman's Ravine, fly fishing on the White River, backpacking on the Long Trail. In his 70s he discovered the delights of watercolor painting. Best of all, he loved sitting around the dining room table surrounded by his family and dear friends. He was president of the Woodstock Historical Society and on the Board of Directors of the Vermont Institute of Natural History.
