He guided many famous people including Ted Williams, and in 1960 he took Interior Secretary Stuart Udall and Commerce Secretary Luther Hodges fishing in the Bay and those trips led to the formation of Biscayne National Park and the halt to what would have been the disastrous development and devastation of South Bay. He is known for designing flats boats with Bob Hewes, and his yellow Hewes Bonefisher, the "Grasshopper" was a fixture in Biscayne Bay to the point where local anglers now refer to the oceanside of Old Rhoads Key as "Curtis Point". He was the first to configure a poling platform at the stern of his skif which he could stand on to spot fish and pole his Hewes boat. Everyone made fun of his "fish cleaning table". Poling platforms are now standard equipment on every flats boat. In 1968 he filmed several television shows with Curt Gowdy and Joe Brookes, which basically put South Florida flats fishing on the map. Everyone wanted to catch a bonefish with Capt. Bill. Around 2000 he was one of the founding members of the Bonefish and Tarpon Trust. After Hurricane Andrew, Bill became a fixture at Bass Pro Shops fly-fishing Dept. in Dania and then later in Miami. He was always willing to share his knowledge of fishing, fly-fishing, tying flies(of which there are several that he created), and mentoring future fishing guides. He held several fishing records over the years. There were few fishing celebrities that didn't fish with Bill over the years, and some even after his retirement in 2005. In 2012 he was inducted as a Legendary Captain in the International Game Fish Association. He was and always will be the Master Guide of Biscayne Bay.
